



Now you can select the content in the chapter you want students to focus on.

- 1. If you have specific learning objectives you want students to study, you can choose them by clicking on the **concept boxes**. It's important to track which specific concepts you included for future reference. You can create multiple assignments for the same chapter if there are several concepts you want students to review.
- If you want students to study the chapter overall, you can use the **slider bar** on the right side of the page to set how much time students should work on the assignment. This is an estimate, the amount of time an assignment takes will be unique for each student.
  - a. *Please note*: The slider bar estimate does not include the time spent reading, it is the estimated time students will spend *answering* questions related to the key concepts in the assignment.
- 3. Click **Continue** in the lower right-hand corner.

### Accessibility Capabilities

SmartBook 2.0 provides a more accessible student experience by including improved color contrast, descriptions for images, increased keyboard navigation, and enhanced screen reader support. Work is ongoing to improve the user experience for all users. A VPAT is available upon request.

### Use SmartBook 2.0 Reports

SmartBook 2.0 provides student and classroom data to instructors to give them an added level of insight into how well their students understand the concepts being taught in class. The reports are broken into a series of five tiles that provide different information.

### Access reports

To access SmartBook 2.0 reports, click on a SmartBook 2.0

### **Report Tiles**



1. The first tile shows the percentage of students who have completed the assignment. When you click on the tile, it will bring up a bar graph below where you can see which students have completed the assignment, are still completing the assignment, or haven't started yet.

2. The second tile shows the estimated time of completion vs. how much time it is actually taking students to complete the assignment. Clicking on this tile also gives you a breakdown of how much time individual students are taking to complete the assignment. You'll also be able to see how much time students are spending answering questions and using learning resources.

3. The third tile shows students' metacognition report – or how they performed on the assignment overall. You can also download a report that details which questions they answered correctly/incorrectly and how they rated their confidence in their answers.



4. The fourth tile identifies concepts that were challenging to students in the assignment. Clicking on the tile brings up a list of challenging concepts, which is defined as an accuracy of less than 65% across the class. Click on the Load More button to see the full list for your class. You can also review sample questions for each objective listed.

5. The fifth tile provides data on individual learners, where you can search student performance by name. When you look up a student you'll be able to see their completion percentage, time on task, if the assignment and recharge have been completed and their awareness or confidence levels. You'll also be able to see a list of their most challenging concepts.

#### Recharge Assignments

#### SmartBook 2.0 Grade posting

SmartBook 2.0 assignments are auto-graded and the grades can post at two potential times.

- 1. When a student fully completes the assignment, as indicated by the progress bar.
- 2. When the student has not turned in the assignment by the due date. The assignment will be graded based on how much they have complete in the assignment.

Both you and your students will be able to see the grades when they post in the Connect gradebook.

#### Student experience

You can see what the assignment will look like for your students by clicking on the Student View button in the upper-right corner of your Connect page. We also have assignable student orientation videos available for you to use at the beginning of the semester. To assign the videos:
